- People with Severe Mental Illness<sup>2</sup>, without psychotic symptoms (also called positive symptoms).
- People with high risk mental states<sup>3</sup>.
- People with Sensory Disability: visually, hearing and visually and hearing impaired.
- People with Physical Disability. Without difficulties in fine motor skills able to use Smarphones.
- Senior Citizens.
- Children.
- Refugees.

<sup>2</sup>Schizophrenia (F20.x), Schizotypal disorder(F21), Persistent delusional disorders (F22), Induced delusional disorder (F24), Schizoaffective disorders (F25), Other nonorganic psychotic disorders and unspecified nonorganic psychosis (F28 and F29), Bipolar affective disorder (F31.x), Severe depressive episode with psychotic symptoms (F32.3), Recurrent depressive disorder (F33) and Obsessive - compulsive disorder (F42), according ICD-10 (WHO, 1992), adults' diagnosis.
